## Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The strategic goal determined to achieve change among citizens was divided into the following chosen procedures:

- to better understand the thinking of immigrants, the reasons for their migration
- increase international partnership and promote mutual tolerance,
- to remember and appreciate the history of the EU, to present historical moments to the younger generation
- to develop volunteering and solidarity, especially in times of need and for the development of the personality of young people, preparation for life
- to rule out intolerant behavior towards others, to behave without differences in terms of gender equality
- to value the European cultural heritage
- think about the need to maintain the quality of the natural environment

The partial goal was active two-way communication with the participants about current EU topics and to listen and solve the needs of individual target groups for the future.

We started the first day of the event with a professional lecture, where we focused on famous personalities and their achievements within history, this topic helped us as a professional example of gender equality. We also moved on to the events that happened in 2000 - the Charter, an important pillar of the protection of the rights and freedoms of EU citizens, which, in addition to the constitutions of the member states, ensures the protection of fundamental rights and human freedoms. The discussion about the future of the EU took place in the questions of what the participants expect from the EU in the future. We also focused on adolescents, because this is the most important transition in the development of a "child" to an adult. It was important to maintain a positive mindset and not think about discriminatory differences. All this affects the life of an individual. The gastronomy of nations was a pleasant revival of the first day. We ended the opening day with brainstorming on Euroscepticism and folklore and dance performances by artists from all partner municipalities.

The second day of the event brought the benefit of new knowledge from various topics. We actively worked with seniors and children through creative and playful activities, we also included physical activities with children. At the same time, the children were also enriched with language skills. We also discussed environmental problems such as climate change. As part of a specific cultural identity, we presented well-known local personalities such as František Tokár - the most successful Slovak table tennis player in history, Ján Tužinský - novelist and essayist, author of literature for children and youth, Terézia Žilíková, a prominent painter and author of poetry. We also visited an important historical monument, the Baroque mansion from the end of the 18th century belonging to the Szentiványi family with a family mausoleum and crypt from 1874 and folk architecture from the 1930s. On this day, a topic such as migration came to the fore, connected with the discussion with the Roma ethnic group, which is located right in the inner part of the village. In the evening, we sat down with the participants of the event to get to know each other better and establish new European friendships.

The last day of the event was focused on professional lectures, workshops, and discussions. The activities were devoted to various topics and all participants took part in them, regardless of nationality, faith or sexual orientation. The aim was to develop knowledge about social policy, volunteering, discrimination and various national and local projects. Currently, unexpected natural disasters are happening not only in Europe, but also elsewhere in the world, which significantly affect people's lives, which is why we devoted ourselves to the presentation of solidarity in underdeveloped countries, help during natural disasters and during a pandemic situation. We continued with a special interview with a psychologist: How to manage the pandemic and not go crazy? In the village of Beladice, the Association of the Disabled operates, which is a voluntary civic association that brings together citizens with any long-term health impairment, who have a more complicated life and have to overcome quite a few problems. In its activities, it is guided primarily by the principles of humanity and charity. They considered the presentation of this union to citizens, together with their acquired practical experience, very important and influential. In addition, we presented the goals and priorities of the well-known UNICEF project. The presented project was in full compliance with this national project. The meaning of democracy nowadays versus in the period of totalitarianism helped us to think about why we should value our EU. We ended the event by strengthening the partnership and analyzing the knowledge gained from the project.
